



Home Learning Arrangements Year 9 and 10



Answering your Questions

Q. Is this just an extra school holiday?

No. A whole school closure is very unusual and has been ordered by the government. The expectation is that you will stay at home and will complete school work from there. During your normal school hours (08:45 – 15:00) you should be completing school work.

Q. How will work be set?

All work will be set using ClassCharts. You should review your account daily in order to see what work has been set.

In most cases teachers will be setting large pieces of project-based tasks so you won't necessarily have a daily update.

Updates may also be sent via email so it is important that you check your SCHOOL EMAIL daily.

Q. What if I don't have access to ClassCharts or school email?

You need to contact your Year Leader as soon as possible to make them aware that this is the case.

Your Year Leaders will be working from home and can make the necessary arrangements for you to have accounts reset.

Q. Do I have to complete the work set by my teachers?

Yes. Teachers will want to see the work that you have completed when you return to school.

You may also be asked to submit work to your teachers by email in order to check on your progress whilst at home. Individual teachers will make these requests via ClassCharts or email.

Please let your Year Leader know before leaving. An alternative arrangement will be put into place.

- Mr Parker will be the main point of contact for exams and will keep parents and students informed of any planned disruption to exams. Currently it should be stressed that this is NOT expected to happen and we must all continue to prepare for exams as normal.

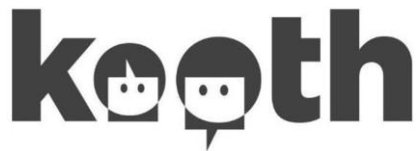
